Nord Anglia Education and Colegio Menor Quito Child Protection and Safeguarding Statement

Our Commitment and Guiding Principles

Nord Anglia Education and Colegio Menor Quito are committed to enabling our students to realise their ambitions through facilitating learning in the safest possible environment, whether a physical or virtual education environment. Our students are empowered to make decisions for themselves and are supported through specific elements of the curriculum to keep themselves safe and healthy such as through personal, social and health education and wellness programmes.

Nord Anglia Education and Colegio Menor Quito recognise that having safeguarding and child protection procedures does not mean that all risk to our students is eliminated. Rather, we expect all Colegio Menor staff to recognise where a student is suffering or likely to suffer harm and to do all they can to reduce further risk or further harm. This extends to all staff and volunteers in Colegio Menor Quito and any contractors or partner agency staff used by the school.

We recognise that staff in Colegio Menor Quito are particularly important in protecting our students. They are in the best position to identify concerns early and to provide help for students. They are ideally placed to prevent concerns from escalating.

Consequently, Colegio Menor Quito employees are expected to adhere to these basic principles, whether they are based on campus, regionally or centrally:

- A student's welfare is paramount and each student has the right to be protected from harm and exploitation and to have their welfare safeguarded, irrespective of race, religion, ability, gender or culture.
- All students need to be safe and feel safe in school and in the virtual education environment.
- Every student is entitled to a rich and broad curriculum that helps to equip them to keep themselves safe.
- Every adult in school must have a demonstrable commitment to protecting the students with/for whom we work.
- We work in partnership with parents/carers and/or other professionals to ensure the protection of students.
- Our guiding principle throughout is 'the best interests of the students'.
- All students have the same equal rights to protection but we recognise that we need to do
 more for some students because of their special educational needs, disability, gender,
 religion or sexual orientation.

(Note: All principles apply to both physical and virtual education environments)

Aims and objectives

Nord Anglia Education and Colegio Menor Quito aim to:

- Provide world class, safe and happy environments to enable students to thrive and learn.
- Outline the systems and processes that we all take to ensure that students remain safe at school and in the virtual education environment.

- Raise staff awareness of safeguarding/child protection issues and define their roles and responsibilities in reporting possible cases of abuse.
- Identify and support students who are suffering or likely to suffer harm.
- Ensure effective communication between all staff on child protection/safeguarding issues.
- Set out effective procedures for staff, volunteers and third- party individuals who encounter any issues in relation to child protection/safeguarding to follow.
- Be clear with all parties, including students and their parents/carers, regarding our approach to safeguarding and child protection through the provision of clear policies and guidance.

Accountability and Ownership

The Child Protection Statement and procedures will be endorsed and adopted at the highest levels, both in Colegio Menor and in the organisation. They will be adopted by our Executive Committee (EXCO) and signed off by the CEO. These procedures will also be applied to any partner agency with unsupervised access to children and young people through their work with Colegio Menor Quito, as well as any contracted organisation.

Definitions

Safeguarding

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children refers to the processes of protecting students from harm, preventing the impairment of their health and development, ensuring that we seek to improve the general health and well-being of all students in our care and enabling every student to have the optimum life chances and enter adulthood successfully.

Child Protection

Child Protection is the core element of safeguarding and is defined as the responsibility to protect children who are suffering or likely to suffer from harm as a result of abuse or neglect.

Rationale

Our Child Protection and Safeguarding Statement and the detailed procedures set out the principles, expectations and processes which must be adopted by Colegio Menor Quito Community. The procedures also describe the steps that are taken in meeting our commitment to safeguarding students at both the school and organisational level.

Colegio Menor Quito Safeguarding and Child Safety and Protection Policy is based on international and Ecuadorian law as well as the **United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989),** of which Ecuador is a signatory.

In addition to Colegio Menor Quito and Nord Anglia Education commitment to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, Colegio Menor Quito benchmarks our safeguarding practice and procedures against the safeguarding standards outlined by the International Task force on Child Protection (where recommendations on common safeguarding standards should be adopted by both accreditation and inspection agencies) and the Ministry of Education - Violence routes and protocols.
